



Napier Girls' High School opened on January 29, 1884 with thirty nine pupils and one boarder. Miss M.E Hewett was the founding principal. The original school course included English, French, Latin, German, Drawing, Singing and Callisthenics.

Today, Napier Girls' High School has a roll of about 1,000 students. It has a strong tradition of successfully educating girls, as well as national success in a wide variety of sporting and cultural activities.

WALKER BUILDING


 Housing modern textiles and food rooms, technology workshop, including facilities for wood, plastics and jewellery, visual arts and the English suite.

Caring for our girls

Senior Leaders, Deans and Teachers keep an eye on every student, tracking her progress in consultation with family.

The guidance network helps every student to feel she is a valued member of the school community and she is developing self-esteem and relating well to others.

- Senior Leaders take a close interest in all students and are available to any student when required.
- Deans oversee the progress of all students in a year group. Parents and students consult with the dean about subject choices, behaviour, classroom and health issues.
- The Vertical Form Teacher is responsible for all students in their form class. The Form Teacher encourages form members to become fully involved in school life, both academically and in extracurricular activities, as well as keeping an eye on her well-being, ensuring the holistic development of all students.
- The School Counsellor assists students with personal, educational or vocational concerns.
- The Future Focus Team provides information and advice to students about their future plans. This includes tertiary and vocational training, job requirements and course selection.
- The Learning Team identifies and provides learning programmes and strategies to assist all students to reach their potential.
- The Well-being Team assists our students to feel good about life and to function as well as possible.

Celebrating our Cultural Heritage

Kaupapa Mãori is integrated into many aspects of learning at Napier Girls' High School. A põwhiri welcomes Year 9 students and new learning staff, hui are held with parents and whanau and the school boasts a strong kapa haka.

Mãori student leadership is actively supported. A Manu Taki is a prefect role of Mãori leadership. She is supported by the kãhui Mãori, a group of Year 12 and 13 students who are elected by the school. The senior Mãori students are trained as mentors for juniors, the guiding philosophy being the 'tuakana teina" (big sister, little sister) relationship. Mãori are also well represented in form captain positions.

Through active participation, a sense of pride and belonging has been fostered among Mãori students, and this is reflected in academic results. The overall achievement of Mãori and Pacific Island students exceeds national averages.

We have annual sports exchanges with Palmerston North Girls' High School and Tauranga Girls' College.



Hewett House Hostel sits on Napier Hill and prides itself on providing a safe and happy boarding experience.


There is a sense of belonging in our hostel, where girls from a variety of backgrounds come together to share their schooling experiences and learn to live together in harmony.

The hostel supports the holistic development of our students' academic learning by a Prep Programme, support from a dedicated liaison teacher and access to e-technologies.

We offer the opportunity for extra-curricular participation and leadership opportunities.

The hostel is a warm, caring and safe home where, around the clock, girls are nurtured by a team of experienced supervisors and support staff, ensuring their safety and well-being. The hostel operates a full commercial kitchen which provides tasty nutritional meals for the girls from breakfast through to supper.

The years spent at Hewett House enable girls to be confident in their own abilities, to be leaders and to have tolerance and empathy for the people around them. Our girls leave Hewett House with lifelong friendships, well equipped with the skills to take on the challenges of life beyond school.
